

## TLI32515 Certificate III in Rail Infrastructure

### DETAILS

The TLI32515 Certificate III in Rail Infrastructure qualification is a general qualification for a person engaged in the rail infrastructure environment, who performs tasks involving a broad range of skilled applications in a wide variety of contexts. It may involve application of some discretion and judgement in selecting equipment, services or contingency measures. It may also include responsibility for coordinating the work of others.

The course contains five (5) core units of competency that are:

- RIICCM201D Carry out measurements and calculations
- TLIE2007 Use communications systems
- TLIE2029 Conduct workplace information briefings
- TLIF3003 Implement and monitor work health and safety procedures
- TLIJ3002 Apply quality systems

PLUS four (4) specialist Track Maintenance units of competency that are:

- RIICCM203D Read and interpret plans and job specifications
- TLIB3094 Check and repair track geometry
- TLIB3095 Check and repair points and crossings
- TLIS3026 Implement track maintenance and construction

PLUS two (2) general units of competency that are:

- TLIB2097 Install and maintain rail guards
- TLIB3099 Examine track infrastructure

### ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Entry requirements for this qualification is TLI21315 certificate II in rail infrastructure (track work) or relevant industry experience. A category rail 1 medical assessment along with a rail industry worker card (RIW) or equivalent must be gained. Must be 15 years or older and no longer at school.
